



Personal Development Credit Program Sport Leadership – Coaching and Officiating

In partnership with the Department of Education, the Department of Communities, Culture, Tourism and Heritage has developed a **Sport Leadership Personal Development School Credit Program** for Nova Scotia high school students. This program is designed to help students build valuable leadership skills in coaching and officiating, while giving back to their communities and contributing to sport development in the province.

Students who enroll in the program can earn a **full school credit** by completing requirements in either coaching or officiating. To qualify, students must complete a total of **110 hours** that combine sport-specific education with practical experience, such as coaching practices and games or officiating matches.

Below is a summary of the activities, students must complete to be eligible for the full credit in this program.

Frequently Asked Questions

- 1. Does this program have to be completed within a school year?**
No. The program can be started at any time in Grade 10, 11, or 12 and must be completed before the end of Grade 12.
- 2. Can I combine both coaching and officiating?**
Yes. You may complete both coaching and officiating activities toward the credit, but you can only receive one credit once the 110-hour requirement is met.
- 3. Can I complete the program using two different sports?**
Yes. Hours from two different sports can be combined to reach the 110-hour requirement.
- 4. Can I be paid for my coaching or officiating hours?**
Yes. Both paid and volunteer hours count toward the program.
- 5. Can I apply coaching or officiating activities completed before enrolling in the program?**
Yes. Any official coaching or officiating courses completed before your enrollment date can be applied. **Grade 11 and 12 students** – all coaching and officiating activities recorded in your logbook can now be credited back to **January 1, 2025**. **Grade 10 students** – activities can be credited from the **date of enrolment** in the program.
- 6. Can students from schools outside the public school system participate in the program?**
Yes. You would need permission from your school to have the program recognized as an academic credit.
- 7. I have already chosen my courses. Can I change them?**
No. Only the school can make changes to your courses. Please see your guidance counsellor to discuss how to add the Personal Development Credit for Coaching and Officiating.

8. Is there a cost for taking the courses?

There is usually a fee associated with the sport specific or officiating courses but in coaching these can be covered by the organization. There are no costs for the additional courses required to complete this program.

Program Overview

In a partnership with the Department of Education and Early Childhood Development, Sport Nova Scotia, the Department of Communities, Culture, Tourism and Heritage has developed the **Sport Leadership Personal Development Credit** for high school students in Nova Scotia. This program is designed to help students build valuable leadership skills in coaching and officiating, while giving back to their communities and contributing to sport development across the province.

The program is open to all Nova Scotia high school students in **Grade 10 or above** who are involved in coaching or officiating with a **community sport club** or [Provincial Sport Organization](#) that is a member of **Sport Nova Scotia**.

Students enrolled in the program can earn a **full school credit** by completing the requirements in either coaching or officiating. To qualify, students must complete a total of **110 hours**, which include both sport-specific education and hands-on practical experience—such as coaching practices and games or officiating matches.
