

# Halifax Hawks Minor Hockey Association 2024/2025 President Summary

#### **Financial Overview**

The Halifax Hawks ended the 2024/2025 fiscal year with a **\$5K surplus**, achieving **\$768K in revenue** and **\$763K in expenses** (including depreciation). While registration revenue increased, fundraising declined, prompting the board to reevaluate the viability of monthly raffles.

Key financial highlights:

- Total revenue: \$768K (*up* \$47K)
- Season registration revenue: \$671K (largest source)
- **Operational expenses:** \$135K (slightly lower than last year)
- **Divisional expenses: \$521K** (ice rental remains the highest cost)
- CEBA Loan Repayment: \$40K fully repaid
- Reserve Fund: \$174K, sustaining financial flexibility
- 2025/2026 Budget Preparation: Finance Committee targeting approval by Sept. 2025.

#### Ice Management & Optimization

- Unused Ice Costs: 72 sheets of ice (totaling 83 hours) went unused, costing \$18,260.00.
- Strategies to reduce unused ice:
- Address ice contracts early to return ice unlikely to be sold.
- Improve scheduling efficiency within **CMHL/MMHL master schedule**.
- Expand **PD day technical camps** to optimize ice usage.
- Launch a **Tournament Committee** to better utilize available ice.

# **Competitive Program Highlights**

- U15AA secured both the CMHL Championship and Hockey Nova Scotia Provincial Championship banners.
- **U18AA** named **Most Improved Team** of the organization.
- U13AAA traveled to Quebec for the International Pee-Wee B.S.R. Tournament.
- **U13AA** competed in **New Hampshire's President's Day Tournament**.
- Policy Updates:

- Non-parent coach travel policy revised.
- **Tryout appeals** process updated.
- **Discipline management:** Recommendations align future decisions with **Hockey Nova Scotia policies**.

# **Recreation Program Highlights**

- New players and coaches joined across all levels, growing community participation.
- Member feedback & suggested improvements:
  - **Earlier team selection** to allow fall tournament participation.
  - Half-point scoring system (1-5) for more precise evaluations.
  - Stronger enforcement of safety rules for excessive contact.
  - **Consistent penalties** for behavior violations, including **dressing room attire, phone policy, gear fitting issues**.
  - **Limit friend requests** to prioritize balanced teams; AP rules require clearer communication.
  - **Third-party report handling** requires standardization to reduce frustration among parents and volunteers.
  - **Greater integration of call-up practices with competitive teams** for stronger skill development.
- Team-specific updates:
  - U15C Blackhawks captured three titles, Birthplace of Hockey Tournament, Gold Division Championship & the City Championship.
  - **U18 Rec:** Patriots finished **14-6**, and the Titan won the **Bronze Division Championship**.
- Future program enhancements:
- Tiered registration option for U18C players to include additional practice/tournament ice.
- **Expanded community engagement:** Team presence in parades, dryland training demo days.
- Hockey 101 & Coaching 101 workshops for new families.
- Centralized resource pool for association-wide development tools.

# U9 & U7 Program Highlights

- **U9 (115 skaters)** focused on structured skill development, expanded goalie training, and structured practice sessions.
- **U7 (121 skaters)** improved skating fundamentals, participated in multiple jamborees, and benefited from structured evaluations.

- Recommendations for next season:
- Expand Sunday practice ice for U9 (3 hours to 4 hours).
- Increase **U7 session availability** for better scheduling balance.
- Implement monthly goalie clinics for U7/U9.
- Enhance coach onboarding with a "Welcome to Coaching" workshop.

### **Community & Fundraising Initiatives**

- Player Assistance Fund: Helped 20 families access discounted or complimentary registration.
- **50/50 Raffles:** November's draw raised **\$5K**, but subsequent jackpots declined—future plans under review.
- Gear Exchange Weekend (Sept.): Assisted dozens of families with equipment.
- **Give Back Weekend (Dec.): 13 boxes of food** collected for Fairview Food Pantry—engagement methods under review.
- Rawk the Rink (Jan.): Featured U11AA, U13AA, U15C, with Mooseheads autographs as a highlight.
- Volunteer Appreciation Night (Apr.): Honored coaches, managers, board members, and Hawks Award recipients.
- U13AA Toy Drive & U13A Bottle Drive: Raised funds to support a local family over the holidays.

# **Upcoming Initiatives & Challenges**

- Hawks Golf Tournament (July 8): Fundraiser to support 25 young players for next season.
- **Registration Fee Adjustment (2025/2026):** Proposed **3% increase** to offset rising expenses while maintaining financial aid.
- Jersey Depreciation: Replacements or management strategies required for the upcoming season.

The Halifax Hawks remain committed to **financial sustainability**, **player development**, **and strong community engagement**, ensuring a thriving hockey program.

I would like to extend my sincere appreciation to our board members, managers, coaches, and volunteers for their dedication and countless hours in making this past season a success.
