Suggestion to have Jake McDonald talk to the younger players and do an on-ice session as a means of recruiting, developing, and retaining Officials. Ed Bowers and Lisa Gordon offered to support RIC and help with assigning officials. Suggestion to work with other associations and do joint training sessions.

Officer Reports:

First Vice President/Risk Management: Dodie Peters (submitted in advance)

It was a busy, complicated year. Our Association received a total of 17 suspensions (14 to players and 3 to coaches). Coaches and bench staff did a really good job at getting all their credentials and getting their CRC/VSC completed in a timely manner. Thanks for all the great work you have done this year.

There was a Hockey Nova Scotia Independent Third Party (ITP) complaint. All parties were interviewed, and HNS considers the case closed. I was informed there may be another ITP complaint coming through from another association in early December, but I heard nothing about it, so I assume it was handled with that association.

Second Vice President: Leah Roy (submitted in advance)

What a season! As second VP this year I tried to make myself available to the managers as well as anyone else who reached out. If I didn't know the answer, I tried to give the best answer or direct them to the answer. We held our managers meeting at the beginning of the season, and a few emails with info were sent as well. I appreciated everyone working so hard for the teams!

In discussions for next season helpful to bench staff would be player movement and team division done sooner. If players are moved down to develop then need moved back up can coaches manager from both teams be aware, perhaps a group email or quick meeting? Player movement with a small team and no plan made for extra work and communication between all wasn't good. Another option for the key for under stairs, perhaps another cut for the manager? Is there one at the rink? If the head coach happened to not be there, they couldn't get in for the supplies needed for practicing.

Can the development schedule for the entire season be announced early?

Is there any chance of the rink putting in Debert ice early enough to do tryouts for the 2025-2026 season?

Coaches handle on-ice, but managers handle the rest and that can be a LOT! Thank you doesn't seem to be enough but again THANK YOU to everyone who volunteers for all these athletes! You're appreciated more than you'll ever know :-)

Equipment Manager: Brianna Burris (submitted in advance)

The 2024-2025 season was a great year for updating equipment.

We were able to purchase new first aid kits for all teams, 17 new weighted pylons, green bands for underage referees and 3 new sets of goalie gear for U9.

Thank you to Sportchek Truro who donated 100 pucks to the association. We also bought another 50 new pucks for the teams to use this year.

We were also able to change the lock for the cubby under the stairs. All head coaches were given a key, and most have been returned. I have reached out to U9 Intermediate, U11, U18C to bring theirs to the AGM.

A new set of jerseys for U18C #5 has been purchased [Note: The Turner family requested to purchase their sons' U18 jerseys, since they both wore the same #5, which was approved at a prior board meeting. They paid the cost to purchase two replacement jerseys].

We had some struggle at the beginning of the year with the size of the jerseys not aligning with the size of the children in that age group. I did some moving around and I believe everyone was satisfied.

I am currently getting quotes for new jerseys for the upcoming season. I would like to order different numbers than the 1-20 each team so if there are sizing problems like this year, it is much easier to manage and move jerseys around.

I am currently in talks with Tim Hortons Canada to continue sponsoring our U9 division.

Meeting Discussion:

Discussion regarding the idea to purchase new jerseys. Some feel the jerseys we have are ok; the white jerseys are in rough shape but the black ones are OK; suggestion to purchase only new white jerseys and possibly use the funds for tryout jerseys instead; suggestion to purchase goalie jerseys, which are designed specifically to go over goalie gear; there is a company that makes reversible jerseys, with two different colors so you flip them over. If we get new jerseys, can we use the existing jerseys at tryouts or auction them off as a fundraiser.

Action: Brianna to get three quotes for replacement jerseys. Any purchase will have to be approved.

Action: Board to meet online over the summer for final decisions regarding jerseys.

Action: Dalce and Leah will ask around to see if we can get sponsors for jerseys, using a shoulder patch not the sponsor bar, or perhaps helmet stickers.

Comment that we need more pucks, at least 50 pucks per team is recommended; could keep all or extra under the stairs. Brianna acquires new pucks every year.

Coach Coordinator: Greg Roy (submitted in advance)

I can't thank all our bench staff enough!

Of note we need to give more time to organize our coaches next season. It wasn't fair on the short notice they all had. Would also like a development schedule released for the entire season at the start so there's no last-minute planning. U13C should be moved to another evening practice as it was on Monday, leaving them with four + days between practice and a game. Their whole week of hockey was Sat Sun and Monday.

I know the best coaches spend countless hours off ice planning for the many hours on ice and it doesn't go unnoticed.

As coach coordinator it was my role to ask the most qualified coaches to take on the role and you all found great assistant coaches too. Some levels had a LOT of requests and some had none that wanted to tackle the head coach. The last two seasons our head coaches remained the same but this year everyone's players moved up starting teams anew. I commend everyone on successful seasons. Not all seasons are based on wins but rather positive growth and all around we succeeded.

I had a meeting with coaches at the beginning of the season to go over the basics and where they can find drill info etc and sent out texts this touching base throughout the year so they were aware if they needed anything they could reach out anytime.

For anyone interested in volunteering next season watch your emails & the WCMHA Facebook page mid summer as a Google form will be shared to put your name in for helping. Keep in mind there are online expectations that must be completed upon being asked to help at the expense of WCMHA. Not completing these online tasks cause penalties to your team, specifically suspensions. And it's noted annually who has to be chased to get these done. We know it's a pain but it's hockey Canada and hockey ns who demand them be completed. Please don't do any of these online courses until you've been assigned to a bench.

Coaching is a selfless role and without you all the kids couldn't play.

The U11 team had a highly successful season, capturing three championship banners. A significant number of our players demonstrated the skill level to compete at a higher tier, such as B-level, which contributed to our strong performance against many of the teams we faced. More importantly, the players thoroughly enjoyed the season and had a lot of fun on and off the ice.

We were fortunate to have a strong group of coaching staff and dedicated volunteers throughout the season. Our team manager, Lauren, went above and beyond in her role and played a key part in creating a positive and memorable experience for the players.

The team budget was submitted to Leah by Lauren; I have not yet reviewed it personally.

There were a few isolated incidents involving inappropriate comments from parents on social media. These matters were addressed appropriately by the association. For future seasons, I recommend that expectations regarding social media use be clearly communicated to parents at the beginning of the year to help prevent similar situations

U13 – Lisa Gordon (submitted in advance)

U13C - Manager: Brianna Burris, Team rep: Lisa Gordon, Head coach: Scott Smith, Treasurer: Cameron Maceachen

Our team played well this season and were competitive in the league. We were at the top of the standings. Unfortunately, they were knocked out in the playoffs.

The U13C won the Friendship tournament and came home with silver in the Windsor tournament.

We had a year end party which was enjoyed by all. We played laser tag and awarded three members of the team Esso medals.

U13A - We have \$16.80 remaining in our team bank account, which will be transferred to WCMHA for the Friendship Cares committee (see budget attached). U13A finished their season as Scotia Minor Fundy/Highland League Champions. They were unable to defeat the Glace Bay Miners to advance to the provincial DOC (it was a tough loss as we lost in a shootout after one OT period). The kids played an amazing season and we as coaching staff are very proud of their accomplishments this year.

We also came home with Gold medals from the Gary Wentzell tournament in Bridgewater in March. The kids also won Silver medals in the Tri County Tournament in Fredericton Junction back in December.

We had a year end party for the kids last night (April 18th) playing laser tag. It was enjoyed by all. We awarded 3 members of the team Esso medals and announced the player being awarded the Cobras Pride award later this month at the AGM.

U15 – Crystal Slack (submitted in advance)

This season, we had a young team with a smaller roster, which brought its own set of challenges. The players navigated the ups and downs of the season while also navigating the changes and challenges of the teenage years. Overall, we had a fun season aside from some additional parental issues toward the end of the year.

With a strong start next season, we're aiming to continue growing a positive team culture and further develop the skills and team spirit of our players and parents.

U18 – Dalce Shipley (submitted in advance)

U18C- We had a great season! The kids played their hearts out. We competed in four tournaments this year. We won second in our West Colchester Cares Friendship Tournament and brought home the banner and Gold in the Annual Trevor Ettinger and Jeff Smith Memorial Tournament. We made it to Semi's in our U18C league playoffs. Though the season wasn't perfect (there is never one that is) there's not much I'd change as far as the kids and the way they represented our association. We had our year end party, A meal and laser tag to celebrate our 3 graduating players and a successful year!! Manager Darcy Dobson

U18A- Our season is all over now, what a year!

Starting off we had 32 kids at tryouts, ending up with 15 skaters and 2 goalies, employing 5 bench staff, plus a treasurer and a manager to keep everyone in line and on track. Hats off to Sara Murphy and Tanya Bowers for doing the heavy lifting, and to Harrison McLeod, Tom Shreve, Brookes Vantassel and Cory Murphy who helped guide these young men through the season.

Our first half of the season had a few bumps along the way, with 3 main injuries; a broken wrist, a fractured elbow and a collarbone injury. Another setback was the ice time/gametime juggling to accommodate *mainly* one team to get their high-school players to play! To top it all off, it wouldn't be U18 without a couple suspensions. All this aside, the kids managed to keep going and pushed each other along the way to do better every practice and game. This effort paid off, we had an undefeated season with 20 league games, 6 playoff games, 4 exhibitions, 4 tournaments, and a Day of Champions match - 51 games in total - all capped off by winning the Provincial Banner.

It's hard to say anything negative with such a successful year, but... I would like to mention that we heard more negative comments piling up as the year went on and we continued our winning streak because often with success comes scrutiny. Comments such as, "Your team must be scared to play in a AA league!" or "You should have been a AA team, you stacked your team!" were not uncommon to hear. These comments were directed at our team not only from opposing players, but also parents, and even coaches. At the same time, it's worth noting that some of the teams in our league *maybe* should not have been playing at the U18 A level of hockey. As a coach, I've been on the losing end of the things before, (as everyone in here probably has) but I really don't mind being on that side of the game, as it encourages the kids to work harder, and get better over time. This year, we had 4 sets of brothers on our team, which was fun for them and gave us a bit of an extra advantage because each knew how their other brother played the game. Some of the boys didn't want to play in the AA league; whether it be for the late weeknight games in the city, or maybe they didn't want to play in the town league because they wanted to be with their buddies in Debert. Despite this negativity, the team persevered,

and really showed up on the scoreboard when it was time to play our game. In my mind, playing hockey doesn't get any better than when you're playing with your friends.

After such an awesome year with a great group of kids, we're planning a well-deserved day of paintball and a BBQ to celebrate our successful year, as well as our 8 graduating players. Coach Al
